My great grand father Franz Brueggeman emigrated with family from Ramsbeck, Germany to America in 1881 as part of the third and smallest of the great waves of German immigrants. They moved to Mankato, Minnesota and stayed with his sister and her husband Anton Balkenhol. Then Franz and family moved further west in 1883 to Zell, South Dakota, where my grandfather Andrew Brueggeman was born. Bruegge means bridge so there are plenty of variant spellings in Belgium, Netherlands, and Germany. My last name originally had two "n"s on the end but was Anglicized. I'm mostly German, with a wee bit of the Irish in me from my grandmother Casey on my mother's side.
