


Scenes at Palomar Resort





PALOMAR MOUNTAIN

PALOMAR Mountain, famous as the location of the World's largest observatory, is about 2 hours drive from San Diego and 3½ hours from Los Angeles, via the newly constructed "Highway to the Stars." Chosen because of its peculiarly clear air, free from smoke, haze and fog, Palomar has almost perfect visibility. Even without the telescope the stars seem nearer; and moonlight on Palomar is a sight that is never to be forgotten. Visitors should plan to spend at least a day exploring the mountain, which is especially delightful during the morning and evening.

The huge telescope, one of the world's greatest scientific achievements, has become a major attraction for tourists in Southern California. No trip to California would be complete without a visit to this famous spot which is only 15 minutes drive from the Palomar Lodge.

Aside from the scientific appeal, Palomar Mountain is one of the most scenic mountains in the southwest. It rises abruptly from the valley to an elevation of over 6000 feet above sea level. The mountain now has the new "Highway to the Stars" winding up its face, traversing grassy valleys and cool, densely shaded canyons, then penetrating forests of fir and cedar, stately pines and rambling oaks, intermingled with spruce. Truly a place to study nature where nature abounds in all her glory.

Huge ferns form a unique feature of the landscape. Varying in height from two to eight feet, they make a dense covering of vivid green for hills, fields and canyons. For the lover of birds and wild flowers, Palomar is a fascinating field, abounding in varieties not found at lower altitudes.

THE VIEW

Palomar Mountain rises so abruptly from the valley that it affords a magnificent view of the surrounding country. The panorama includes 150 miles of coast lines extending from Catalina Island to far into Mexico.

ABOVE THE CLOUDS

At times all the views of the lower country are blotted out by a blanket of clouds. This endless expanse of billowing fog, broken only by mountain peaks, which rise here and there like islands, is in itself a sight never to be forgotten.

At this elevation the air is free from fog. The days are warm, but never too hot in the shade. The nights are cold enough to make the camp fire or the big fireplace at the lodge very attractive

PALOMAR MOUNTAIN RESORT

Is located about the center of the range, at an elevation of 5,350 feet. It is in a small valley surrounded by heavily wooded hills, about a quarter of a mile from the crest of the mountain, where the view is best.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Guests may have their choice of rooms in the lodge, tents or cabins, with running water, toilets and showers.

We give close personal attention to the kitchen and dining room, and make every effort to maintain the best possible standard. Our meals are characterized by their homelike quality. We have an abundance of strawberries, raspberries, loganberries, blackberries, currants, in season. Our tables are supplied with the best of rich cream and milk. Fifty feet from the lodge is an ice-cold spring which furnishes water for drinking and cooking.

Palomar Lodge is located on a mountain ranch. It is operated by its original owners and because of its home atmosphere it is especially suitable as a vacation place for boys unaccompanied by their parents.
