The parts have 77 on the axle lock nuts and also on the other components. The bike has original components and I have confirmation that the seller bought it from the original owner L Stabilini. The brakes are old style with the flat adjusters on the calipers. I believe that sometimes when a bike was being built up they used parts in stock rather than ordering new.

I will gladly answer as many questions as I can. I have an e.mail from the seller confirming it is a 1978 frame and not one from

I purchased the bike from Tuscany and I am the 3rd owner.

The bike is in original condition with the name of the first owner subtly placed on a plaque on the cross bar (L. Stabilini). Rumoured to be the son of the architect who worked on the original Vigorelli velodrome in Milan.

The frame is an original Competition. The frame number 4568 is stamped on the bottom bracket and front fork stem. This frame was the same as Piero Gavazzi rode to win the National Road title and resulted in the company attaching the decal on the down tube between the gear levers. He also won Milan San Remo and numerous stages in the Giro.
