

(many pantograph). As for the frame/bike, it is s/n#: "57 8355", which puts it at about 1983, per your timeline. Component dating also supports this, via hub lock nuts (82), rims (GP4), crank arms (circles with a 1 & 2), rear mech (SR) is "Pat. 82), etc. However, the BB shell has the "Olmo S.p.A." and not the "Olmo s.p.a." that you describe for the 1983-? models. I've attached a pix. If possible, given your experience with Olmo, can you please enlighten me with an opinion? I have a lot of pix with the rest of the frame's features if you need.
